
Congratulations on being elected president of The Jacksonville Bar Association. As a Jacksonville native, your tenure as president means more to me than you can imagine.

On behalf of the Jacksonville Field Office of the FBI, please accept my congratulations on your recent election to the presidency of the Jacksonville Bar Association. I read with interest the article in today's Florida Times-Union and was most impressed with your background, particularly your commitment to public service and to the advancement of equal employment opportunities.

As you know from your experience with the United States Attorney's Office, the PBI has a strong record in defending the civil rights of all Americans and remains the agency with primary responsibility for investigating violations of those rights. Beyond that, the PBI is more committed than ever to recruiting and hiring qualified minorities so that we can more effectively reflect the population we serve. Currently, 15 of the PBI's Special Agents in Charge or Assistant Directors are African-American. We are proud of that fact, but we know we need to do more to continue to attract qualified minorities to our organization.

To that end, the FBI has launched a number of innovative programs. Among these are an internship program for students at historically black colleges and universities, and an exciting new partnership with EdVenture, where the FBI sponsors university courses that let students design and manage a campaign to market the FBI on their local campus. Such a course was just approved for the Fall 2004 semester at Florida A&M University.

I would welcome the opportunity to meet with you to share ideas about how best to reach minorities within the North Florida area, and to explain the exciting career options with the FBI that are available to the talented young professionals you no doubt meet on a daily basis.
